This week has flown by. As I sit here writing this for the newsletter I can't quite believe just how much we've managed to fit into one week. On Monday morning Lucia and Thomas arrived at my office door with a large envelop full of letters written by the children in Cherry Class. They have been learning all about the story of The Jolly Postman. The letters were full of advice for me on the best materials to use to build a den in my garden. They used their knowledge of the Three Little Pigs building materials and most of them suggested that I should use bricks and not straw, however I was particularly impressed with Emily's idea of building it from jewels as it would look beautiful and shine in the sunlight. The children's use of the conjunction "because" to explain their reasoning was very impressive.

On Monday afternoon we welcomed some visitors from the church into school to help each child make their Christingle orange, it is always an exciting time turning the cocktail sticks, candle and orange into a Christingle. The older children also helped the younger children. On Tuesday we welcomed Mrs Tomlinson, a student teacher from Bath Spa University. Mrs Tomlinson will be in Lime Class alongside Miss Griffin for the next 3 weeks. Lime Class have been learning about Chinese New Year, have made Chinese lanterns and even managed to recreate a Chinese dragon dance in their outdoor area. On Tuesday afternoon it was the turn of Oak Class to take part in the Anyone Can Cook session, they made Couscous Sandcastles, Pizza and Melon boats. Also on Tuesday we welcomed our local parishioners in to school for another "Open the Book" assembly. We do enjoy these assemblies and the children are always keen to participate with the acting.

Our Christingle on Wednesday afternoon over at the church was lovely. Christingle is a church service I always remember attending as a child. Some of our year 6 children read their prayers and the choir sang beautifully. Most of the children managed to resist the temptation to eat the sweets on our walk back to school. Look out for the candle collection boxes in book bags, as promised by Reverend Steve, for the Children's Society.

The other exciting news this week is about our Internet connection; (I know it may not seem that exciting to some) but we have been waiting for a very long time for an improved internet service to school. Now thanks to Rob Knott and his IT Team from Kingdown we have super-fast broadband! Rob has worked incredibly hard and has shown determination and lots of perseverance in getting it sorted for us. We are extremely grateful to him and the team. Faster internet in school means the children can all use the internet at the same time, teachers can upload photos onto the webpages without having to go and make a cup of tea while they waited for it to work and the ladies in the office and I can continue to work online when a class visits the IT Hub. This is revolutionary to us and now enables us to continue to improve the resources we have for Computing in school – Miss Tout our Computing Subject Lead is very excited; she has already put a long list together of things we can do now. It is also perfect timing for "Safer Internet Day" next Tuesday. As I'm sure you are all aware the virtual world is becoming more and more a part of daily life for our children both at home and at school. Safer Internet Day aims to promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for children and young people. Each class will be learning about the importance of safe online use and completing different activities during the week. We will be starting the week off with an assembly. 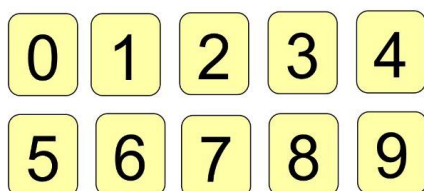
