

Mathematics

This term we will be continuing our addition and subtraction using different mental strategies to recall facts and develop our understanding of multiplication and division using grouping and sharing.

We will also be returning to 2d and 3d shapes and their properties as well as learning to measure and record using standard units.

Time, movement and position and the language for these will also be covered.

PSHE

Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds

This topic will cover knowing that the body is special; medicines and household substances; sun safety & the importance of exercise as well as rest & sleep.

English

Through our topic the children will be writing lists, labels and captions; finding and recording facts from different sources; writing a non-chronological text and an imaginary persuasive letter.

They will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction texts and practising their reading skills in Phonics and Guided Reading.

They will continue with developing spelling and hand – writing skills.

History

Through our topic the children will find out why we remember Florence Nightingale as a significant figure in our history. They will use a timeline to recount her life and work and compare modern nursing with nursing in the past.

Geography
