## Key Stage 1 (Year 2 SATs) - 28 Children – 12 Male, 16 Female

At the end of KS1 (Year 2), teachers are required to assess each child in the areas of reading, writing, maths and science. National Curriculum assessment tests are used to support teachers' judgements.

## Key Stage 2 (Year 6 SATS) - 29 Children – 13 Male, 16 Female

Key stage 2 results no longer use the previous systems of levels – instead, test results are converted into "Scaled Scores" – with a score of 100 being the expected standard. Any

score below this means the pupil is working "towards the expected standard" and any score above means the pupil is working "above the expected standard".

Average Scaled Score Reading: 102.8

Average Scaled Score Maths: 105.5

Average Scaled Score SPAG: 104.8

Dilton Marsh pupils performed below the national average in Reading, GAPS and Maths. The combined score was below the national average. These are disappointing results and we have put together a clear action plan for schools improvement in place, which is already having a measured impact.
