Dear parents and carers

In non-COVID times, this week our Year 6 children would have been taking their end of Key Stage 2 assessments. Many of the children look forward to this opportunity to show how much they have learned during their primary years. For others it is all about the SATs breakfast! All the children will be undertaking assessments in term 6 although they won't be reported nationally as in other years. This includes phonics screening for younger children, Multiplication Tables Check for year 4 and NFER or past SATs papers for years 1 to 6. All assessment results will be shared on the end of year reports in July.

From Monday we will be moving into Stage 3 of the Government Road Map. Within school this won't make a huge amount of difference to our day to day practices. However, it does mean we can be more secure in organising events over term 6 which we will share in due course. It also means we can invite our Reception parents into school for their parent evening sessions. Many of our Lime class parents have never been into the school, or classroom, or visited back in 2019 when they were choosing which school was best for their child. We are hoping that we can organise an opportunity for other parents to view their children's work later in the summer term (dependent on COVID restrictions).
