EYFS Data - 27 Children - 13 Male, 14 Female

A Good Level of Development is defined as children working at the expected standard or exceeding the expected standard in the key areas of literacy, maths, physical development, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

Key Stage 1 (Year 2 SATs) - 30 Children – 20 Male, 10 Female

This is the third year of the new testing and assessment arrangements for Year 2. These arrangements reflect the more challenging National Curriculum which was introduced in 2014. At the end of KS1 (Year 2), teachers are required to assess each child in the areas of reading, writing, maths and science. National Curriculum assessment tests are used to support teachers' judgements.

Expected Standard – Working at the expected standard for a child at the end of Year 2

Greater Depth – Working at greater depth within the expected standard, with a strong understanding of the curriculum

Key Stage 2 (Year 6 SATS) - 26 Children – 10 Male, 16 Female

Key stage 2 results no longer use the previous systems of levels – instead, test results are converted into “Scaled Scores” – with a score of 100 being the expected standard. Any

score below this means the pupil is working “towards the expected standard” and any score above means the pupil is working “above the expected standard”.

Average Scaled Score Reading: 104

Average Scaled Score Maths: 101

Average Scaled Score SPAG: 102

Dilton Marsh pupils performed below the national average in Reading, GAPS and Maths. The combined score was below the national average. These are disappointing results and we have put together a clear action plan for schools improvement in place, which is already having a measured impact.
