Another busy week particularly for our Year 4 children who took part in the trial Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) run by the Department for Education. This is a new assessment for all year 4 pupils which will be compulsory from 2020. The purpose of the MTC is to make sure the children's times tables knowledge is at the expected level.

The MTC is an online test were the pupils are asked 25 questions on times tables 2 to 12. For every question you have 6 seconds to answer and in between the questions there is a 3 second rest. Questions about the 6, 7, 8, 9, and 12 times table come up more often. The questions are generated randomly based on the rules of the MTC. To prepare the children Chestnut class have had lots of practise and Times Tables Rockstars has been really important in helping the children to improve their knowledge. All the children in Year 2 to Year 6 have a log in for this so please ask if you have mislaid yours.




