Attendance of learners with SEND

In Acom Education Trust, we monitor the attendance of children and young people with SEND very closely. Research illustrates that attainment is directly affected by attendance and those who attend school poorly, also achieve poorer outcomes. Average attendance of SEND across the Trust is just under 90%. Let's work together to bring this up next term and target 95%. We really do need our learners with SEND in school so that we can work with them on their areas of need. School can be very tiring for learners with SEND and it is important to acknowledge this. However, the more they are in school, the more progress they will make and ultimately be ready for their world in their time. If your child is struggling to attend school regularly, the headteacher will be in touch with you. Please do not hesitate to contact the school if you are concerned over your child's attendance – we all want to help.
