



Dear Parents and Carers,

Apologies for the late delivery of the newsletter this week. On Friday, when we normally write it, we were busy exploring ways to welcome back all the children who want to return this term. We are pleased that we have managed to offer everyone who requested a place one day in school from next week. By rearranging the classrooms and reducing furniture in the rooms we are now able to allow up to 11 children in some classrooms; this still allows for the 2m social distancing rule. If you have requested a place you will receive a separate letter to inform you of the day your child will be returning to school each week until the 17th July. During these days we will allocate time for transition activities in preparation for September.

As I am sure you are aware the government announced last week that it would like all children to return to school in September. We are hoping that we will receive the guidance by the end of June to help us plan what this will look like as it won't be a return to what we remember as normal. As soon as we hear more we will inform you to enable you to plan for September.

Flu Vaccinations 2020

If your child is due to be in Reception to Year 6 from September 2020 then they will be eligible for the free nasal childhood flu vaccination which is being delivered in schools between October and December 2020. This will be administered adhering to all the up to date Infection Control, PPE and social distancing guidance in place at the time.

Flu vaccination is one of most effective interventions we have to reduce pressure on the health and social care system which is going to be more important than ever this year. For this reason, it is essential we deliver the vaccine to as many children as possible to prevent the spread of infection to those most at risk in society.
