### Term 3 Newsletter 6 - 14th February 2020

It is hard to believe we are half way through a school year – we are already planning ahead for educational visits in the summer term to enhance the children's learning. This term has been an interesting one as we published our Ofsted Report. Thank you to all our parents for their support and positive feedback and of course, our staff for working so hard to embrace changes in order to move the school to Good.

This week has been a busy one; visits from Fire Education, visits from Mrs Dinwiddy to Beech class and the Dance Festival of course. We are always proud of the way the children show respect to visitors and always receive positive feedback about them. The Dance Festival was a huge success, well done to all the children and many thanks to Mrs Down and Miss Tout who have been coaching the children through the last 6 months so that they could dance with so much confidence on the night.

#### **Ofsted Action Updates**

This week we have been developing English and Maths to ensure that there is more consistency across the school. This will ensure that Leaders are able to monitor what is being taught and when, more effectively.

Mr Bullen and I visited a school new to the Acorn Education Trust, Wansdyke Primary School, who have been using a Maths scheme for the last 18 months. They have had positive results, both in terms of teachers understanding of Maths Mastery, but also in terms of consistency of teaching approaches. We were impressed with what we saw and are now looking at how we can make this work in Dilton Marsh.

Mr Foyle, our Literacy Lead, has been reviewing our Literacy curriculum across the school, tying up when each area is taught. This has included ensuring that high quality texts are available in each class as either a whole class reading book or available for individual reading. As part of this he has been auditing how much reading is going on at home. It is the expectation that all children read at least 4 times a week and that parents sign that this is happening. For some children this will need to be with an adult every time, for others it may only be necessary once a week linked with questioning about what has been read. Mr Foyle is holding a reading meeting next term to give advice on the sort of questions you could ask to develop understanding.

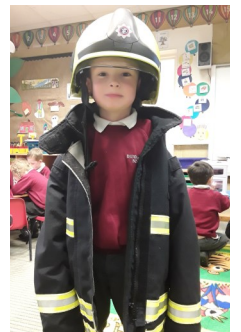


Riley & Liberty from Year 6 shared the following:
