Having attempted the papers myself, I am fully aware of the challenge and application required!

As I walk the school every day I am always so impressed with the creativity and ability to problem solve demonstrated by of all of our children. In Ash class this week I witnessed some fantastic extended writing and it was a pleasure to be invited along to hear the children proudly read out their compositions. Beech class were really being challenged in the use of BODMAS in their Maths lesson, but coped superbly and demonstrated great understanding. Within Chestnut class the competition was rife in terms of spelling adjectives in a game of scrabble; a great, fun way to practice spelling and vocabulary. The story of The Hungry Caterpillar was being retold by Cherry class and the children's imaginations really came alive in their story planning. Lime class children proudly talked to me about their woodland faces that they had made which were placed amongst their beautiful woodland display.
