# Friday 18th January 2019

It has been great to meet so many parents this week; it really enables me to gain an insight into how we are doing as a school. It is obvious that all the staff know your children well and are working hard to ensure that each child gets the support and challenge they need. If you have any concerns about the progress your child is making please make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher. By working together we can make a difference to their learning.

As a staff we have been reflecting on Reading across the school. At the beginning of Term 2 'The Power of Reading' was introduced. This approach is about teaching Literacy through using high quality books and creative teaching approaches such as art and drama. As a result the children are more engaged in their literacy learning and it deepens their understanding of texts and provides a meaningful reason for writing. Having read the children's writing throughout the school and listening to the way they are able to discuss the texts I can see that this is impacting on their reading comprehension.

Alongside the Power of Reading we continue to use a number of strategies to ensure children's individual reading improves. Each class approaches reading slightly differently, especially as the children progress through the school. However, all classes will have times when they are able to read independently, share books or read their own books for pleasure. There will be individual reading or Guided Group reading taking place each week. As well as decoding the words this will give adults a chance to discuss the text with the child ensuring they have a good understanding and are not merely 'barking at print'. Unfortunately time and 'person-power' is limited which means we cannot spend as much time on these as we would like. This is where we need parent/carers help. The chart below gives an idea of how important it is that children read at home and continue to read throughout their school lives. Ensuring children read at home does not only improve their reading but it also improves their vocabulary and their speaking and listening which then impacts on their writing. Even a fluent, confident reader should be reading at home daily in order to continue to improve. This can be reading to themselves but even better reading aloud so they can improve on expression and you can ask them questions to improve their understanding. Research shows that children who read books often at age 10 and more than once a week at age 16 gain higher results in maths, vocabulary and spelling tests at age 16 than those who read less regularly.

This term I am challenging each class to bring their reading diaries in daily. This will enable us to monitor how often the children are reading at home. Then, in Term 4 I am going to launch a Reading at Home Class Challenge which will run for the whole term.




## FRIDAY 1ST FEBRUARY




