Dear Parents,

It has been yet another busy and wonderful week...

The week has continued with many classes continuing the theme of Roald Dahls birthday as it links in well with our whole school topic this term of "Footprints from the Past." Car Parking Near to School

Unfortunately this week we have been informed a couple of times about congestion and car parking problems near to the school. We have had some local residents expressing concerns as they have been unable to get their vehicles on and off their drives because of parking by school traffic. It has also been bought to our attention that there are a number of vehicles dropping children off on the main road by the zigzags or at the entrance to School Lane with children then exiting cars onto the road. Cars have also been seen reversing out onto the main road where children are crossing. The safety of all our children is paramount, so please be very considerate when driving, dropping-off and parking.

If you do arrive by car, please arrive in plenty of time and park a little distance from the school. Please do not put any child at risk by parking unlawfully or inconsiderately. Yellow zigzag markings outside the school are designed to create an open area to allow those crossing a good view of the road in each direction so that they can cross safely. We are very lucky in Dilton Marsh to still have a Lollypop lady and I'm sure you will agree Bev does a fabulous job. Drivers parking or stopping to drop off within these markings, even for just a few seconds, are breaking the law and are creating an unacceptable danger to our children. Blocking residents' driveways and parking on the pavement is also inconsiderate and creates hazards for children and parents using the pavements.

Please can I ask that drivers be considerate to others on their journey to and from school; we want to ensure that all pedestrians and drivers arrive safely and feel safe on their journey to our school.

PLEASE ALSO REFRAIN FROM PARKING IN FRONT OUR GATES EVEN IF IT IS ONLY FOR A SHORT WHILE! THIS IS OUR ONLY ACCESS AND IF WE WERE TO REQUIRE AN EMERGENCY VEHICLE FOR A CHILD OR ADULT AT SCHOOL THEY WOULDN'T BE ABLE TO GET TO US.

House points...

We have introduced a House Points System at Dilton Marsh C of E Primary School. Children are grouped into four House Teams. These are Kestrel, Merlin, Falcon and Hawk. Each child is placed in a House on entry to school and remains a member of this team throughout their time at the school. Siblings are placed in the same House team. House Captains are elected from Year 6 pupils following a letter of application and a group interview. They provide positive leadership to the children in their House and during the various competitions and events organised throughout the year.

On Sports Day the Houses compete against each other as teams and a cup is awarded to the winning House. Teaching and non-teaching staff also belong to a House, with the exception of the Head teacher, and they encourage and support the children in positive team building through the House system.

The House Captains are responsible for leading their House in competitions and events, and representing the school in the community and a range of school events and activities. The responsibilities of the House Captains are:

- to set an example to the other children
- to earn house points and encourage others to do so
- to represent the house when collecting awards
- to be somebody others can turn to for advice

Below are our current House Captains:

In addition to the House Captains, every child in year 6 is presented with a star badge to wear throughout the year showing their house team colour. This will enable the younger children to identify who is in their team.

Earning House Points:

House Points can be awarded by all staff to children for a variety of reasons. For example:

- Polite, well-mannered behaviour
- Demonstrating a caring attitude towards peers
- Working to the best of their ability
- Excellent attendance
- Putting special effort into a piece of work
- Neatly presented work
- Positive attitude towards work
- Sporting achievement
- Taking part in competitions and events
- Helpful approaches to different situations

Every Friday, the house points are counted by our House Captains and a weekly winner announced during our Achievement Assembly the following Monday morning. These are then added to the house points display tubes in the corridor.

House points are then tallied over the course of a term, a winner is announced, and the children in that house are rewarded with a special event or treat. Each team will also get £50 to donate to their House Charity. The charity the House wants to support is decided in September each year by the House teams, the captains then write a letter to their chosen charity explaining that they will be raising money throughout the year for the charity by earning house points. The House teams can also decide throughout the year to run sponsored events or hold a stall at the fayre to raise extra funds for their chosen charity.

At the end of the year, once all house points are tallied, the House Champions will be announced. The winning house will be awarded their ribbons on the House Cup.

The house system aims to encourage a real sense of pride and achievement for the children. It fosters community spirit and gives the children an opportunity to contribute to something bigger, which involves children from all year groups. The older children are positive role models and take on a pastoral role for the younger children. We are looking forward to developing our House Teams system this year with lots of exciting team events planned.
